SAN DIEGO CONTINUING EDUCATION: Award Year: Fall 2017 & Spring 2018

PURPOSE

The “San Diego Promise” is designed to provide resources to ensure no deserving student is denied the opportunity to attend college because of limited family income.

The program is structured as a “last dollar” award, which means students are required to apply for and accept all financial aid (except for student loans) before receiving the “Promise” scholarship. The program will fulfill any unmet need awardees have for fees and/or instructional materials, including textbooks and supplies.

PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY (Must meet *ALL* of the following criteria)

- Participants must have a high school diploma (or equivalency) or will have earned it by June 30, 2017.
- Participants must enroll in a San Diego Community College District (SDCCD) college for the fall 2017 semester.
- Participants must be residents of the state of California for tuition purposes (or AB 540 eligible). AB 540 eligible students are students who have attended high school (or the equivalent) in California for three or more years. Students who have a F-1 or Visitor Visa are not eligible.
- Participants must file the 2017-18 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or a Dream Act application, and accept all aid with the exception of student loans.
- Participants must be currently enrolled in San Diego Continuing Education (SDCE) and have attended a minimum of 100 hours from Fall 2016 to April 14, 2017.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- Enroll in and successfully complete a minimum of 12 units each semester (fall and spring)
- Remain continuously enrolled for one academic year (fall and spring)
- Participate in a community service component (8 hours/year)
- Complete all “Student Success and Support Program” requirements prior to registration: assessment, orientation, and education plan
- Participate in college wrap around services i.e. EOPS, FYE, Peer Navigators, Price Scholars

The purpose of the San Diego Promise is to provide resources to students who want to attend college and need financial assistance with fees, books and supplies. Students must be currently enrolled in a San Diego Continuing Education (SDCE) class and have a minimum of 100 hours of attendance since fall 2016. Students must also have a high school diploma (or equivalency) or will have earned it by June 30, 2017.

HOW TO APPLY

STEP 1: Complete this application, including answers to the five (5) supplemental questions below.

STEP 2: Request one (1) letter of recommendation from an SDCE instructor

STEP 3: Submit an online application to Mesa, City, or Miramar: <http://www.sdccd.edu/>

STEP 4: Complete the 2017-18 FAFSA application: <https://fafsa.ed.gov> (or Dream Act). Attach proof of submission.

STEP 5: Submit the completed application and letter of recommendation by Friday April 14, 2017 by 4 p.m. to the San Diego Promise Counselor Representative from your campus.
