1	ESL Beginning Literacy 1 (ESLA 431)	10	Morning or Evening	Focus on the alphabet, numbers, and basic vocabulary.
2	ESL Beginning Low 2 (ESLA 432)	10	Morning, Afternoon, or Evening	Focus on beginning listening, speaking, reading & writing.
3	ESL Beginning High 3 (ESLA 433)	10	Morning, Afternoon, or Evening	Focus on high beginning listening, speaking, reading, & writing.
4	ESL Intermediate Low 4 (ESLA 434)	10	Morning or Evening	Focus on intermediate listening, speaking, reading, & writing.
5	ESL Intermediate High 5 (ESLA 435)	10	Morning, Afternoon, or Evening	Focus on high intermediate listening, speaking, reading, & writing.
6 / 7	ESL 6/7: Transition to College (ESLA 437)	10	Morning, Afternoon, or Evening	Focus on college level listening, speaking, reading, & writing.

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ESL+ Career Exploration – Course 1 & ESL+ Workplace Communication – Course 2

Learn English and develop workplace oral and written communication skills. Develop speaking, vocabulary, reading, writing, grammar and computer skills. Research career and vocational pathways for advancement and success. Develop a resume/cover letter and prepare for job interviews in course 1. In course 2, focus on professional English, communication, presentations and other work-related soft skills.

3	Beginning Pre-Vocational ESL Course 2 (ESLA 426B)	10	Evening	Learn the beginning ESL skills you need to be successful on your job and communicate with your supervisor and co-workers.

1 - 3	ESL Beginning Conversation (ESLA 450)	5	Morning, Afternoon, or Evening or Saturday Morning	Develops beginning level listening, conversation, pronunciation, and vocabulary skills. Practice speaking in English using real-life situations
4 - 7	ESL Intermediate / Advanced Conversation (ESLA 451)	5	Morning, Afternoon, or Evening or Saturday Morning	Focuses on intermediate and advanced listening, conversation, pronunciation and vocabulary skills. Practice speaking English in academic and workplace situations.
2 - 3	ESL Beginning Grammar (ESLA 454)	5	Afternoon or Evening	Introduces basic grammar for speaking and writing. Practice using grammar in everyday situations
4 - 7	ESL Intermediate / Advanced Grammar (ESLA 455)	5	Afternoon or Evening	Focuses on intermediate and advanced grammar for various speaking and writing purposes.
2 - 3	ESL Beginning Reading (ESLA 456)	5	Afternoon	Develops beginning reading skills. Learn how to read basic English stories and news articles. Reading skills will help you to be successful in school, at work, and at home.
4 - 7	ESL Intermediate / Advanced Reading (ESLA 457)	5	Morning, Afternoon, or Evening	Develops intermediate and advanced-level reading skills with a focus on vocabulary development, reading strategies, and comprehension. Interesting and relevant

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				reading practice will help you improve your reading fluency and accuracy for success in school, the workplace, and personal life.
1 - 3	ESL Beginning Pronunciation (ESLA 452)	5	Afternoon	Introduces the sounds of letters and basic words. Learn and practice beginning pronunciation rules.
4 - 7	ESL Intermediate / Advanced Pronunciation (ESLA 453)	5	Afternoon	Focuses on pronunciation rules and strategies for effective communication in professional and academic settings.
